



2010 Concert for Life Offers Show-Stopping Music For People Living With HIV/AIDS

A Night on Broadway
Friday, April 30 at Foundry United Methodist Church

WASHINGTON, DC -- At a time when AIDS in the National Capital area has peaked to epidemic levels and funding has declined, the Concert for Life goes on for the 17th time in 18 years to help beneficiary organizations save the lives of people living with HIV/AIDS. The concert, *A Night on Broadway*, is set for Friday, April 30 in the sanctuary of Foundry United Methodist Church on 16th and P Streets, NW.

Since its inception, the all-volunteer non-sectarian Concert for Life artists and organizers have raised more than \$700,000. Every dollar from ticket purchases and donations -- 100% of all CFL proceeds -- goes directly to beneficiary organizations.

The songs and music of Broadway chosen to inspire hope and uplift spirits will be performed by a talented array of featured artists with the Concert for Life Choir and Orchestra, assembled and directed by versatile Washington choral and jazz musician Stanley J. Thurston who is Foundry's Music Director. Guest soloists will include established and aspiring musical theater artists working in the Washington, DC area.

A pre-concert reception in Foundry's Fellowship Hall offers light fare beginning at 6:30 p.m. for concert donors.

Long after the music fades, donations the Concert for Life will still be at work for the beneficiary organizations in Washington, DC and Africa. Past beneficiary include several organizations that serve the area's neediest, most at-risk populations:
